

## Dear Healthcare Professional,

Daratumumab, the ingredient in DARZALEX FASPRO<sup>®</sup> (daratumumab and hyaluronidase-fihj) and DARZALEX<sup>®</sup> (daratumumab), binds to CD38 on red blood cells (RBCs), which results in a positive indirect antiglobulin test (indirect Coombs test). This may interfere with the ability to accurately detect antibodies to minor histocompatibility antigens in the patient's serum. This effect may persist for up to 6 months after the last treatment. The determination of a patient's ABO and Rh blood type are not impacted.
